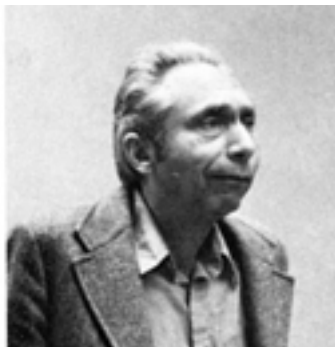


George Radin
